Town of Plattsburgh DCO report for June 1, 2022 through June 30 2022. During this time I was called upon to perform the duties of the DCO for the town of Plattsburgh five times. I have also received and fielded multiple phone calls from residents ranging from dog barking complaints to welfare checks on animals. In most cases the callers were told to contact the town of Plattsburgh and follow the procedures that were set up.

1/ June 20 Received a phone call from Sgt. Christopher Holland of the Clinton County Sheriff's Department, requesting my assistance in securing two dogs. Sgt. Holland stated that the subject was arrested at the SD. Two German shepherds were picked up from the Sheriff's department and secured until a family member arrived to return them home. 2/ June 24 Received a phone call from the Adirondack pet Lodge informing me that one of their clients had escaped when she was being transported. They requested any assistance I could give. I spoke to the shelter manager and found out that the dog named Hazel was spotted around exit 36 in the town of Plattsburgh. After about an hour of searching, Hazel still has not been recovered.

3/ June 25 At 7 AM on June 25 I received a phone call from NYSP dispatch requesting my assistance at the Comfort Inn and Suites to retrieve a dog from one of the rooms. When I arrived I was greeted by Trooper Bailey. He informed me that one of the guests had to be taken to the emergency room for a medical situation. I retrieved one male Pit Bull by the name of Bandit from the room and the dog was brought to the SPCA and later reunited with family members. A quick side note dog was unlicensed in the town of Plattsburgh individuals were told to license the animal on Monday with the Town Clerk. Situation took about three hours to clear up.

4/ June 25 10 AM I received a phone call from the Adirondack pet Lodge stating that a dog by the name of Nova had been brought in the previous evening. They were looking for assistance in re-uniting the animal with the family. The Kennel Manager stated that the animal could stay there until such time, as she could be reunited with her family. After receiving information on a possible owner phone calls were made to accomplish this goal. Later that day around 4 PM I was notified that the Lodge manager had been contacted by Individual stating that the dog was theirs. The animal was turned over to her family. Although the animal was registered in the town of Peru. The family's new addresses in the town of Plattsburgh. They have been told to register the dog on Monday with the town clerk. Since the pet Lodge Was kind enough to maintain custody of the animal. There will be no fees charged to the town of Plattsburgh by the SPCA **In total, this whole situation took about an hour and ½ to resolve**
